### FROM THE MANSE. . . Called to be a Blessing!

Recently I have been reflecting a great deal on Abram's call from God in Genesis 12.

GOD told Abram: "Leave your country, your family, and your father's home for a land that I will show you.

I'll make you a great nation and bless you.

I'll make you famous; you'll be a blessing.

I'll bless those who bless you; those who curse you I'll curse.

All the families of the Earth will be blessed through you."

So Abram left just as GOD said, and Lot left with him. Abram was seventy-five years old when he left Haran. Abram took his wife Sarai and his nephew Lot with him, along with all the possessions and people they had gotten in Haran, and set out for the land of Canaan and arrived safe and sound.

God asked Abram and Sarai to get up and go to a new place, an undisclosed place, with their family trusting wholly in God. He was sending Abram out into the unknown but giving him clear guidance about what was going to happen. He was blessed, to go out and be a blessing to others and then they would be blessed too.

The Good News of Jesus Christ is such that we can't keep this to ourselves, we can't be selfish saying I'm alright, we need to go and tell others about what God has done through Jesus Christ and in the power of the Holy Spirit.

There are 44 congregations over Scotland put forward and so the selection process starts in November when I, the Session Clerk and the Kirk Session will be interviewed to see if we are ALL up for this challenge. The same challenge God gave to Abram, the same Great Commission Jesus set his disciples at the end of Matthew's gospel. Our lives and the life of King's Park Church carries on God's story from Creation, to today. God calls his disciples to continue his story in the 21<sup>st</sup> Century. We won't be able to do it in the same way as Abram or even Jesus' disciples so how can we in King's Park Church go and be a blessing to others right here, right now?

Are we as Christ's followers today up to God's calling, to be a blessing to others?

### Kirk Session and Congregational Board

The first meetings of the new term were held in September with Session and Board on the same night, now an established feature

After the Session had rededicated itself for another year the major topics of interest were as follows:

"Presbytery Elder's Report" - There will be regional meetings of Churches in various areas starting in November as it was felt that Presbytery as it is, was not being supported as it should. There will be refunds made from Mission and Ministries allocation, due mainly to lower numbers of Ministers as many are retiring. Consideration is being given to the training of Elders to post of Interim Moderator, King's Park will have a representation at next year's General Assembly.

Safeguarding - An enormous debt of gratitude was paid to lan Tomney for all his work over the years and particularly during the summer as it will be illegal after October to work with vulnerable people without PVG authority. John Black will shortly take the reins as Safeguarding Convenor and was wished every Blessing.

Other - Information Security has become a Church of Scotland initiative and meetings of Senior Office Bearers to discuss this are in the pipeline. Aileen Campbell has agreed, upon request by Toryglen, to join their Nominating Committee.

At the Congregational Board meeting, the major topic of consideration was the leak in the pipework, preventing heating in the Sanctuary, and the relatively high cost of repair, to which the Board agreed. Andrew Aitken was thanked for all his work on Gift Aid as he gave his report. There were two resignations which affect the life of the Church - Niall Kinloch as Treasurer, due to pressure of work, a post not easy to fill, and Jacqueline Cumming as Church Cleaner, going to full time work. They were thanked for all their work in the Church. All other areas of business were proceeding apace.

### THE GUILD

At this time of writing, our new session has not yet begun, but I would like to mention some of our forthcoming events. Our Annual Guild Dedication Service will take place on Sunday 11th October at 11am, and it would be really good if all the Guild members could sit together near the front of the Church for this special service.

The Guild will once again hold a special Tuesday Coffee Morning in aid of Macmillan Cancer Care. This will be held on Tuesday 13th October from 10am until 12 noon in the Iona Hall, entry by donation. All are welcome, so please come along and support this very worthy cause.

Our Annual Charity Night will take place on Wednesday 11th November at 7.30pm in the large hall. This time, the entertainment will be the East Kilbride Ladies' Choir. Tickets will be available nearer the time, and will be priced at £3.50 each. The proceeds will go to our two chosen projects, which, this session, are Street Pastors and Breaking the Cycle of FGM. ### Worship

In the July/August issue of the magazine the question was asked "Why go to Church?" One of the five answers to this question was to Worship, to wait upon and to listen to the Word of God (not only through the Sermon, but through prayers, music, offering, scripture reading and perhaps a sacrament). During the weekly service where we attend to meditate upon God and his goodness there should be silence. Belief and Faith are individual statements of emotion. But worship involves a Congregational Fellowship - a togetherness. Do we find God in our Services? Do we need more variety to attract more interest? Should there/can there be less formality? Can technology help to clarify our Faith? Does it?

Is worship only for Sundays? As individuals with questioning minds we must make our own decisions about our beliefs. DO we pray at other times? Do we read the Bible during the week? - our manual for living. In King's Park we have God Tock - our Bible Study Group - currently discussing the life of Jesus in Christianity Explored. We have a Prayer Group that meets regularly. We use Christmas and Easter as mission opportunities in the Community. Churches together - King's Park, Croftfoot and Toryglen Worship at various times. But to live prayer we have to be there!

The Minister in any Church is the hub, the person who presents the Message - who conducts worship. Currently Ministers are thin on the ground and getting thinner as many are retiring and numbers joining the ranks are few. So how do we see worship in the future? The Presbytery through their plan looks 10 years ahead - Elders presiding in various capacities, pioneer Ministry, more practical than doctrinal, also immigrant Ministers are all on the agenda to cope.

Consider Luke 10:2

If we treasure our Worship and God's part in our lives in the future then we must accept changes are probable and Mission essential.

We would like to thank all of you for bearing with us during these works, we hope that the experience of worship out with the Sanctuary has been as spiritually fulfilling a journey as it would normally have been . We would also like to give a special thanks to Ian Henderson, our Church Officer, who ensured the large hall was set out so well each week. We hope to be back in the "warmth" of the Sanctuary soon.

#### PATH OF RENEWAL

Have you ever thought, as a churchgoer, that these days you're very much in the minority? I suppose it depends what generation you are a part of. Sometimes when you step out of the Church it can feel like you're in a different culture! Church, as we know it, is struggling to keep up with the sweeping changes in our 21<sup>st</sup> century culture. Church used to be the centre of our community, both physically and spiritually – now it's most definitely on the edge. We live in a secular country, where the Church, along with other formerly respected institutions, is more or less ignored.

We attend church on a regular basis, for our own personal reasons some of us attending more than others; some getting more involved than others. Around us, attendance diminishes, ministers retire - then can't be replaced, Churches close. It's a fairly depressing scenario. BUT – we're talking about God here; we're talking about Jesus Christ – there's nothing depressing about them! We need to realise that our church model doesn't work anymore - we've lost our attraction. Rather than sitting here waiting for people to join us, we need to take the message of Jesus Christ out there and stay out there with it.

#### Path of Renewal envisages just that.

As Sandra has already said in her letter from the Manse, King's Park has been nominated by Glasgow Presbytery to be a Path of Renewal pilot church. As part of this exercise, Sandra and the Kirk Session will soon be visited by members of the steering group, partly to gauge their support for the project and partly to answer questions. If successful in the selection process, we will start work in January 2016 – no messing about!

Initially, Sandra will be the focus of things, but it'll spread out to include us all in many ways from direct involvement to much needed prayer support. It's also clear that the Church of Scotland is very serious about this programme and will provide regular support and input from an experienced back up team right through from start to finish. The programme seeks to identify people in the congregation who can work as modern day missionaries in the "foreign culture" mentioned above. There will be training and support for this too.

In a nutshell – what we're trying to do is to rediscover our calling as the Church in  $21^{st}$  century Scotland. People need to be rooted in faith – creating disciples, not members! The task is about helping churches move from an insular approach to one where we engage in meaningful ways with those around us – an approach which leaves no one unchanged. It goes far beyond holding mission events to attract people along to what we currently do, but cuts right through the heart of who we are called to be and what we are called to do as God's people.
