FROM THE MANSE. . . Change



Dear Friends,

I've just returned from my walk with the dogs in the park and am very aware of the change in the weather. Even from last week it's certainly a lot cooler, thankfully, but there are also conkers, acorns and other seeds from trees evident on the ground. Trees are turning colour and leaves are falling and making a wonderful carpet on the grass.

I look forward to the changing of our seasons, to the different things we can experience at different times of the year. We welcome spring and summer after our long dark and wet autumn and winter. I seem to get more work done on a dark winter's night when I'm not distracted by the draw of the light and warm summer evenings. What I'm trying to say is that change is not always a bad thing. We can even look forward to change. Grayson, my Grandson who will be one later this month has brought unimaginable change in Alistair and Charlotte's life and changed Lawson and my life too. I'm so glad I had my children when I was young, as looking after Grayson overnight last week meant that I was in bed sleeping at 9 o'clock the night he left!

Can you imagine yourself in the sandals of the first disciple's? In Luke 9 we read how Jesus sends his disciples on a mission:

Jesus called his twelve apostles together. He gave them power to heal sicknesses and power to force demons out of people. He sent them to tell about God's kingdom and to heal the sick. He said to them, "When you travel, don't take a walking stick. Also, don't carry a bag, food, or money. Take for your trip only the clothes you are wearing. When you go into a house, stay there until it is time to leave. If the people in the town will not welcome you, go outside the town and shake the dust off your feet as a warning to them. So the apostles went out. They travelled through all the towns. They told the Good News and healed people everywhere.

Jesus consumed their lives for 3 years, turning their world upside down. They experience first-hand his sacrificial death, fearing and

being anxious for their own lives, then the joy and wonder of Christ's resurrection and finally 40 days later Jesus ascending into heaven. Now that's change on a grand scale, and that was just the beginning for them. And it's the beginning for us too. We as Jesus' 21st century disciples have to consider changing the way "we are church" as it's no longer working today. We need to consider how to grow and develop. One reason people resist change is because they focus on what they have to **give up**, instead of what they have to **gain**. It's not going to be easy but like his first disciples Jesus promises to be with us, leading us every step of the way.

Comments

July: Offerings show a 1% decrease on July last year, and are 1% down on last year as at end of July. Hall Hire income received during the month was £1,000 from ABRSM. The deficit of expenditure over income for the calendar month was £5,446

August: Offerings show a 4% decrease on August last year, and are 2% down on last year as at end of August. Rental income of Church Officers' House fell into September figures, instead of late August as in previous months. The deficit of expenditure over income for the calendar month was £5,534

Messy Church

What is *Messy Church*?

Messy Church is a service of worship to God, but not worship as we know it. It's MESSY, it's on a Saturday, it lasts for 2 hours, and everyone of any age are together all of the time, having fun, sharing and learning about God!



With *Messy Church* we are trying to be a worshipping community of all ages, focused on Jesus, showing Christian hospitality – allowing people to be creative, to sit down together to eat a meal and have fun in church.

We meet together in the church and share some time of fellowship where we play board games, do jigsaws, build Lego and generally spend time getting to know one another. We then go through to the Lesser Hall where we spend time doing crafts and making things related to our theme. In September our theme was *Who is God?* October it's *Who is Jesus?*

And November it's *Who is the Holy Spirit?* We have a great time cutting, making, gluing and glittering our creations which we then take back with us through to the Church providing an opportunity for people of all ages to worship together. We sing along to the guitar, usually with vibrant actions, we tell a story to share our ideas, we act things out and we pray together, finishing with the *Messy Grace*.

 Be no quitter - do not titter KP litter pick

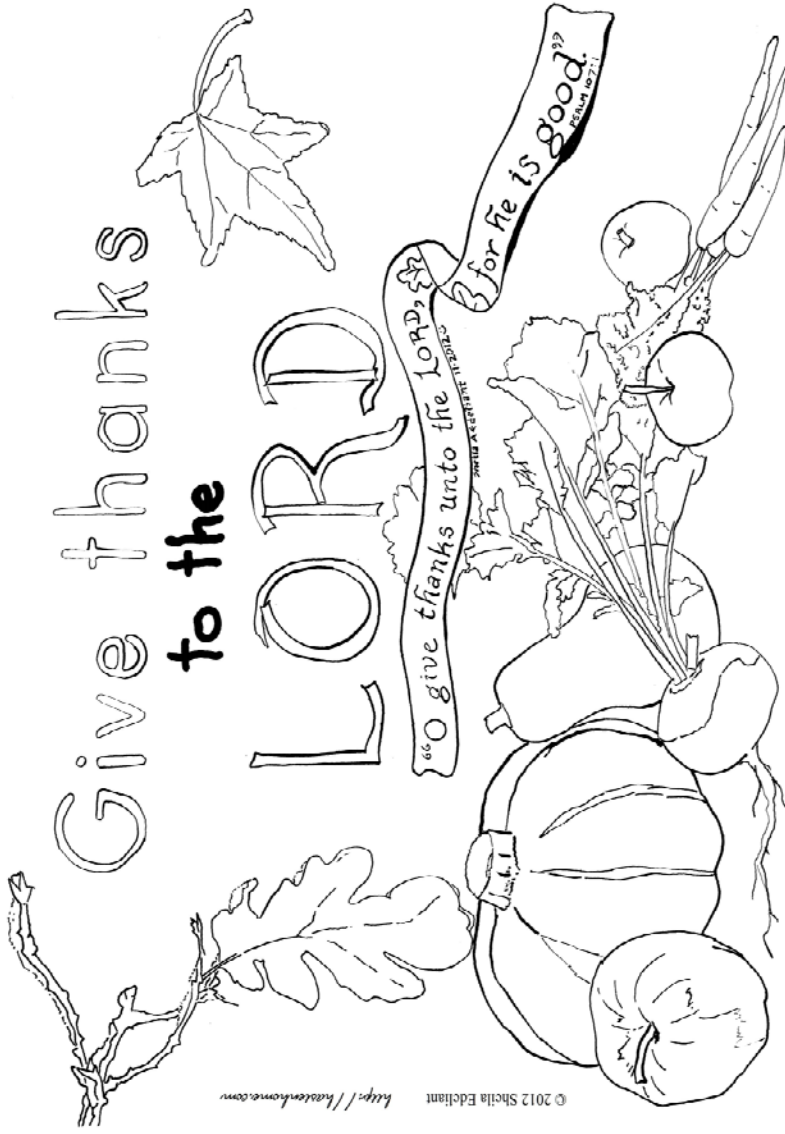
We’ve to do it all again next week, I really cannot wait
