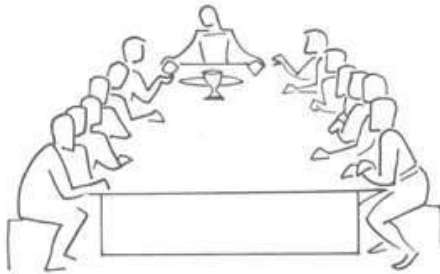

FROM THE MANSE. . . Praying Stones

Holy Week and Easter this year focused on stones; Throwing Stones, Living Stones, Working Stones, placed in a tomb hewn from stone, and on Easter Sunday Morning the stone that was rolled away. Many people did wonder where this theme was



going but like Easter all was revealed. Everyone in church on Palm Sunday was given a stone for their pocket to remind them that we need to speak out for God. We are Jesus' disciples in the world today and unless we speak out the stones certainly won't do it for us. It's not always easy to get Jesus into a conversation and it can be a bit daunting as to how the other person will react if you do, but as Jesus reminds his disciples in Mathew 10:19-20, *"do not worry about what to say or how to say it. At that time you will be given what to say, for it will not be you speaking, but the Spirit of your Father speaking through you."*

We initially don't have to tell someone everything we know about Jesus, but mentioning coming to church, inviting them to the coffee morning, Guild, KP Chicks, The Great Get Together (see later) may be a first step back or into church. Sometimes people just get out of the habit of coming to church and coming along with you may be an easier step than coming alone.

On Easter Sunday everyone was given another stone, this time to give away to someone, either as a starting point in a conversation or to remind us to pray for someone else, encouraging them in faith, asking the Holy Spirit to come into their lives anew, afresh this Easter time. It may help to come to our 10 minute Prayer Group every Sunday morning 10.30am in the lounge?

When I was in my first placement I knew that prayer was essential and so I decided that every pastoral visit I made I would offer to pray with the person I was visiting. I vividly remember five minutes before I was about to leave, my heart started racing and I started thinking about what I was going to say in the prayer. It was difficult at the start and I did make mistakes but the point was I did it and doing it again and again, it does get easier. I still make mistakes but people really appreciate someone praying for them. *When all is said and done, there is usually more said than done!* But that's ok if what is said is in prayer to God, through Jesus. We just need to trust God and he will guide us, our words and our actions following Jesus', and following him, how can we be wrong? God Bless You, Love, Sandra.
