## **Comments**

March - shortfall of receipts after payments made was £6,309. Unrestricted Funds had a shortfall of £3,823, restricted Funds had a surplus of £2,486.

April - surplus of receipts after payments made was  $\pounds 2,362$ . Unrestricted Funds had a shortfall of  $\pounds 523$ , restricted Funds had a surplus of  $\pounds 2,885$ .

## THE GUILD

Millie and I wish to thank everyone at the Tuesday Coffee Morning held in April for the Leprosy Mission when £130 was raised. This sum is included in the total figure of £1,160 which the Guild has contributed in the past year. Of this amount, £735 was sent to Help Heal Nepal. From January to the end of April the British Government were matching



'Pound for Pound', thus it was doubled to £1,470 plus the £425 sent earlier, making a final total of £1,895.

I would also like to thank the Guild members and friends who have given so generously over the years to help the thousands of people who still suffer from this disease and are often shunned because of stigma and fear. Thank you to one and all. Now that the Guild is no longer, donations can still be sent through the Church. *Margaret Atkins*

King's Park has again been busy, raising money for Christian Aid.



Over **£900** was collected this year by our Erskine Bridge walkers, the Three Amigos; Rosie (9mths), Grandpa Alan (older) and Uncle Raymond (ancient), well done to them, but more importantly, a big thank you to their generous sponsors!

Like last year, we've tackled Christian Aid Week by again staying "in-house", rather than going "house-to-house"!

So far we can report that Millie's Tuesday CA Coffee Morning raised over **£85** – fantastic – thanks Millie!

Our Souper Sunday event, supported admirably by the Social & Fundraising team, gathered just over **£254**, and the annual Christian Aid Quiz saw **£140** added to the coffers – thanks again to Lynda and her committee for running this. For those who are interested, this hotly contested quiz was won, *by just half a point*, by Uncle Raymond and his team of younger people, Lyndsie, Mags, Dougie & Sam.
