Dear Friends

This edition of the magazine covers the period up to Easter, and so includes the season of Lent which begins on February 14th (doubling this year as Ash Wednesday and Valentine's Day). The word Lent comes from Middle English, and means "springtime". In the Christian calendar, though, it is a season of preparation for Easter. So, Lent begins in what is still Winter, and ends, hopefully, in much more clement weather for us all.

Personally, I always enjoy the lengthening of the days, and the sense of emerging from the cold and the dark. As I write, we are recovering from a series of storms which brought high winds, and as I walked my dog Barney this morning on the edge of the village where I live, I found that two large trees had come down across the usually tranquil road, and someone had been very busy sawing them into pieces and moving them off to the side for later collection.

Lent lasts for forty days (not counting Sundays) and corresponds to the forty days that Jesus – as the gospels tell us – spent in the desert being tempted to turn away from his mission of obedience to God. We too are invited, during this season, to reflect on our own lives, and our faith, and while that can be a sobering experience, we always observe Lent knowing that it is followed by the celebration of Easter, the high point of the Christian Year, with its affirmation of new life in Christ risen from the grave.

I very much hope that both Lent and Easter 2024 will deepen your sense of belonging in King's Park Church, and indeed deepen your confidence in your faith. The publishing of this magazine, with its news and information about the life of the church, is a sign that you matter as a part of the congregation, and that your prayers are highly valued.

If you are reading this early in February, and the cold and dark still seem to be in command, carry the hope of warmth and light with you through these days as well as the very good wishes of everyone in your church.


'Happy New Year to all friends of KCRC Saidiana Women (Kenya). We are happy to report on the activities undertaken in the last six months ending 31st December 2023. As we begin, allow us to bring to your attention some changes in our name which is now – 'KCRC Saidiana Women (Kenya)'. We want to give glory to God for how far He has brought us despite growing challenges in terms of reduced funding; growing demand for our services, and inflation affecting the cost of doing business generally. The year 2024 is now with us and we hope it will usher in a new 'face' for us as we embark on some key activities including the anticipated Saidiana Safe Homes project.

Our traditional activities, The School of sewing and hairdressing, sewing and knitting, Micro-credit empowerment, Relief supplies, HIV/AIDS Care and Gavin's Mills have all been successful over the second half of 2023, supporting the individuals and families involved in each programme.

Regarding our Safe Homes Project, we have prepared a 'Concept Note' which sets out the background to the project, identifies the problem targeted and the solution to that problem, namely the creation of the 'Sacred Home', a centre open to cater to women and children who have suffered domestic violence for a period of one to three months, to allow them to get back on their feet.

The goal of the Sacred Home will include (1) the provision of emergency protection to victims of domestic abuse in communities where formalised shelters and services do not as yet exist, and (2) creating an opportunity for women to travel to the nearest women's shelter on a short-term basis. As a result of the Safe Homes project, we expect to see more survivors of domestic violence living holistic lives back in the community; more public awareness and involvement in stopping domestic violence in the community; healthy communities with young people well adapted for the future, despite their rough start in abusive homes'.
