Message 'fae' the Manse

Hello friends

One of the most popular TV shows in recent years has been the BBC production The Traitors. Contestants known as 'faithful' take part in a series of challenges hoping to share a substantial cash prize between those who are left at the end. There are, however, 'traitors' in their midst, who will do anything and everything they can to eliminate the faithful and claim the prize for themselves. It is an interesting concept, as we watch the two groups of people all trying to prove to the others that they are faithful, which most of them are, in order to stay in the game, and the deliberations the faithful go through in trying to identify a traitor who will lie to their faces claiming to be a faithful.

I wonder how good we would be at trying to uncover a traitor? Would we believe them when they promise us they are a faithful, or would we know that they were lying? Well, we may never end up on that TV programme, but as Christians, we may find ourselves in situations where we have to test whether or not something is from God and whether it will help or harm us. And it could be anything from something promised to us or a decision that we make in our spiritual journey with God.

So, how do we know if it is from God? Thankfully we don't need to make that decision ourselves. One of the gifts of the Holy Spirit, listed in 1 Corinthians 12, that we looked at recently is the ability to distinguish between spirits, to know if something is really from God. We are also told in 1 John 4 that we are to test the spirits, to see whether they are from God or from another source.

God really does want to bless us through his promises, however, we still need to be careful and check that what we think, or hope what is from him really is from him. God would never do anything to harm us, but the bible tells us that there are spirits that will try to deceive and trick us and that ultimately could cause us harm. So, if you aren't sure if something is from God or not, test it, and ask God for wisdom, discernment and guidance to help you know the truth.

Whilst we may never come face to face with a traitor, we can, through the leading of the Holy Spirit, continue on the path that God has laid out for us, confident that we are going the correct way and that he is right by our side.

KIRK SESSION UPDATE
