We have found our numbers rising recently with over 100 attending September Communion, in addition to those who celebrated with us online. This is lovely.

We also welcome those who have come from Toryglen Church, as well as new faces. Again, it's been lovely getting to know the people behind the new faces.

We're entering a busy time of year with Harvest Thanksgiving where we aim to raise funds for Pakistan, the return of the bazaar on Saturday 26th November and preparations for Christmas! September has brought sadness. Psalm 30 v5 tells us that "tears may flow in the night, but joy comes in the morning." As we look forward to the future, there is joy to come. There is new life in Christ Jesus our King.

IT'S OK TO COME BACK!

Do you remember, back in the October/November 2020 issue of the magazine, we included a photograph of the sanctuary showing seating laid out sparsely in our worship space because of the social distancing rules at that time? It was a depressing sight!

Then, in the Oct/Nov issue in 2021, we printed another photo to confirm the advances made by then. Distancing was reduced from 2m to 1m and people in the same 'households' were sitting together. <u>But</u> – masks were still mandatory.

As you can see from the photo below, taken on Sunday 25th September, during our Harvest Thanksgiving service, things have moved on again.



There is no distancing. There are no masks (unless you feel you want to wear one – it's up to you!). As well as easing COVID restrictions, those of you who are "eagle-eyed" will notice the cameras and new monitors on the pillars halfway up the building. These present the same view as that being streamed live to our Facebook page, every Sunday morning (hopefully, you're familiar with the availability of that service).

The number of worshippers attending has levelled out at around 60 to 70, although, as Eunice & John have said elsewhere in this mag, there were over a hundred attending our September celebration of Communion – which was lovely!

We have a lot to be thankful for at King's Park – some new faces; some new communicant members; a meaningful and enjoyable service with favourite hymns, led by our friends who provide pulpit supply, Sunday by Sunday. The luxury of the same service streamed to our homes, if we so wish, using state of the art technology, with the support of our IT team.

It's great to see the new faces, and as Eunice & John say, "get to know the people behind them", but it would also be great to welcome back those "old faces" who haven't, as yet, returned following the lifting of the COVID restrictions. We miss you and would love you to re-join the physical fellowship which is such an important part of our church family life.

As we move towards the formation of the new Presbytery Mission Plan, we are going to have to change how we do things, and to do that effectively, and properly, we need everyone possible on board - in worship, in prayer and **in-person**, as we embark on a new chapter in our church's life.

So, it's OK to come back and we would love to see you!

CROFTFOOT CHURCH PANTRY

As part of the process of 'clustering', it is important that we find out what each of the churches in our cluster does. As we progress to construct our joint mission plan, we will be aware of things that we don't do, and another church does, or will find that one church has a real strength in, say, e.g. outreach to the community.

Croftfoot Parish Church has established, during the COVID period, a very popular foodbank called "the Pantry". It's open from 11am to noon every Thursday and was catering initially for asylum seeker families, but now, due to the spiralling cost of living, a more significant number of local families are seeking help too.

It would be great if we in KP Church could support Croftfoot's work, spiritually, in our prayers, but also practically, by providing food and financial aid on a regular basis. The organisers would welcome donations of items such as pasta, honey nut & chocolate cereals, tinned vegetables, crisps and sweets. The Pantry buys fresh fruit and vegetables on a weekly basis, as well as other items like toilet rolls and other essentials, so financial donations are also very welcome.

Boxes marked "The Pantry" are placed in the church vestibule and in the entrance to the halls, for food donations, and every Thursday they will be delivered to Croftfoot. If you would like to provide financial support, put it in an envelope marked "The Pantry" and leave it in the offering on a Sunday morning, or pop it through the letterbox to the halls. Any cheques should be made payable to King's Park Church, and we will transfer funds to Croftfoot on a regular basis. Let's join together in faith with our cluster family, at Croftfoot, Castlemilk and Carmunnock churches.

Donations for the Home Baking Stall and Tea Room can be handed into the halls on the Friday Night or Saturday. Bottle and Heavenly Scent Stalls will be supported by the Sunday Schools and Youth Organisations.

The Bazaar Quiz will be available shortly. Hot pancakes, will be on sale from the kitchen as usual.

We look forward to seeing you all on Saturday 26th November. Let's make this a happy and successful occasion.
